Our topic this half term is:



This half term we will be going on a learning journey with a real-life EXPLORER - Gertrude Bell. This heroine from County Durham, who lived in Redcar, travelled to the Middle East and was an instrumental writer and archaeologist in the early 20th century.

We will link our previous topic about rivers, looking at the River Tigris, discuss the impact of pioneering women and the impact of Gertrude in the Second World War and then use her studies on Islam as a basis for our RE learning.

<u>English</u>

How would it feel to be in a distant land in a time where your 'women kind' were not equal? Pupils will write a diary as if they were Gertrude. Then we will use speech and create adventure narratives.
